Course Description	Certificate II in Automotive Servicing Technology prepares and inducts students into the Automotive Industry. This qualification assists in developing the necessary skills and knowledge required to perform routine activities. It also provides participants with experience required to apply for Apprenticeships. Students will participate in off-job training at Quality Automotive Training in Rosewater or Charles Campbell College. The training involves both theory and practical assignments. Students are required to complete five (5) full weeks of Structured Work Placement (SWP) for on the job assessment.		
Pathways	This Certificate II can work towards an Automotive Apprenticeship as a Light Vehicle Mechanical Technician, Heavy Vehicle Mechanical Technician, Automotive Electrician or similar.		
Entry Requirements	Minimum entry level - Currently in Year 11 or 12 (Must be 16 years of age, to enable Student Work Placement).		
Other Requirements	Safety footwear, safety eye wear, long sleeve shirt and pants or overalls. Long hair must be tied back. Resource Fee - May be applicable
